

CMIC TRAVEL PLAN

INTRODUCTION

The CMIC Management seeks to address issues of the Greener and Public Transport Options for Methods of Travel to and from the Mosque. Furthermore, CMIC promote safe cycling and walking routes, healthy living options, and seeks to identify and implement improved safety practices on the site. The vehicle drop off and pick up point for the Mosque will be designated at the Dunheved Road entrances, rather than at the front of the Mosque on the London Road to improve public safety and ease traffic congestion on the main road.

The location of the Mosque is such that it is well severed by public transport and some limited on-street parking. It is within easy walking distance of major transport routes. The Mosque has committed designated disabled parking and intends to install secure bicycle racks.

THE MOSQUE TRAVEL PLAN

The Mosque Travel Plan sets out to:

- 1. Motivate all Worshipers to commit to the Mosque Travel Plan.
- 2. Increase awareness amongst Worshipers of the consequences of travel, and its impact on the environment and others.
- 3. Promote use of public transport through better provision of travel information including on the Mosque website page.
- 4. Elderly worshipers are to be encouraged to use their Freedom passes to and from the Mosque.
- 5. Promote Car Sharing and People Carrier to reduce the number of vehicle trips associated with the Mosque and its activities.
- 6. Encourage the Worshipers to stay in the Mosque during winter season between the Zohar, Asar and Magrib prayers when the timing of the prayers are very close to reduce the number of individual journeys.
- 7. Ensure the Mosque Travel Plan is included in all its information literature.
- 8. The Travel plan will be monitored and regularly reviewed and accordingly reported upon to the CMIC Management Committee.
